Welcome To The Board

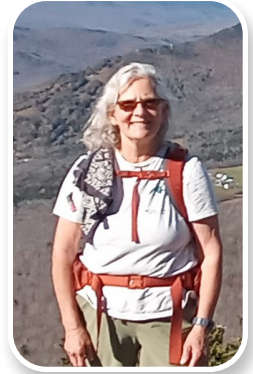


DOT GILBERT
